# Guidelines for Application of the Proposal Defence, Confirmation Defence, Candidature Defence and Thesis Seminar

## in Faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology (Postgraduate Programme)

## **Background**

The guidelines can be used by the candidates in Master of Computer Science (Research), Master of Software Engineering (Software Technology), Master of Computer Science (Applied Computing) and Doctor of Philosophy.

### **Proposal Defence**

- 1. Candidate must have an Active (AK) status in current semester of application/presentation.
- 2. The candidate must obtain the approval/permission from their respective Supervisor(s) before applying.
- 3. Submit **proposal defence report** to the Postgraduate Office one week before the date of the presentation.
- 4. All Master candidate must complete the Proposal Defence not later than second semester of candidature.
- 5. All PhD candidate must complete the Proposal Defence not later than third semester of candidature.

## **Confirmation Defence (PhD Fast Track)**

- 1. Candidate must have an Active (AK) status in current semester of application/presentation.
- 2. The candidate must have completed Research Methodology course.
- 3. The candidate must have completed Proposal Defence.
- 4. The candidate must obtain the approval/permission from their respective Supervisor(s) before applying.
- 5. Submit **confirmation defence report** to the Postgraduate Office one week before the date of the presentation.
- 6. PhD fast track candidate must complete the Confirmation Defence not later than forth semester of candidature.

#### **Candidature Defence**

- 1. Candidate must have an Active (AK) status in current semester of application/presentation.
- 2. The candidate must have completed Research Methodology course.
- 3. The candidate must have completed Proposal Defence.
- 4. The candidate must obtain the approval/permission from their respective Supervisor(s) before applying.
- 5. Submit candidature defence report to the Postgraduate Office one week before the date of the presentation.
- 6. All Master candidate must complete the Candidature Defence not later than third semester of candidature.
- 7. All PhD candidate must complete the Candidature Defence not later than fifth semester of candidature.

#### **Thesis Seminar**

- 1. Candidate must have an Active (AK) status in current semester of application/presentation.
- 2. The candidate must have completed Candidature Defence.
- 3. The candidate must obtain the approval/permission from their respective Supervisor(s) before applying.

- 4. Submit presentation slide and abstract to the Postgraduate Office one week before the date of the presentation.
- 5. PhD candidate must complete the Thesis Seminar before the submission of dissertation for examination.

## **Preparations for Proposal Defence Report**

Proposal Defence Report must consist of 3000-7000 words which includes the following:

- a) Introduction, statement of problem and scope of research;
- b) Research objectives;
- c) Summary of literature review;
- d) Description of conceptual framework or summary of experimental methods or summary of research design and required equipment;
- e) The importance and relevance of the study;
- f) Preliminary findings / Pilot test (initial findings, if any);
- g) Proposed work schedule based on the designated date of submission of thesis / dissertation;
- h) Brief bibliography

Please ensure that the contents of the proposal defence report is consistent with the presentation slide.

## **Preparations for Confirmation Defence Report**

Confirmation Defence Report must consist of 4000-7000 words which includes the following:

- a) Introduction, statement of problem and scope of research;
- b) Research objectives;
- c) Complete literature review;
- d) Solid research methods;
- e) The importance and relevance of the study;
- f) Preliminary findings / Pilot test (initial findings, if any);
- g) Proposed work schedule based on the designated date of submission of thesis / dissertation; and
- h) Brief bibliography

Please ensure that the contents of the confirmation defence report is consistent with the presentation slide.

## **Preparations for Candidature Defence Report**

Candidature Defence Report must consist of 5000-10000 words which includes the following:

- a) Abstract (500 words in Bahasa Malaysia and English);
- b) Objectives and statement of problem;
- c) The importance and relevance of the study;
- d) Brief and concise literature review;

- e) Solid research methods;
- f) Research results obtained so far;
- g) Brief bibliography;
- h) Research plan that leads to the submission of the dissertation / thesis on the designated date; and
- i) List of publications or conference papers presented during the period of candidature, if any.

Please ensure that the contents of the candidature defence report is consistent with the presentation slide.
